The Higgins seed business also has a long history in seed breeding. One of the current successes is Olympus, a long storage crisping variety, which produces very low levels of Acylamide during processing.



Other new varieties which are now finding success include Safiyah which topped the yield figures in independent tests in Egypt, Horizon, a variety which produces yields in excess of 75 tonnes per hectare and is finding a successful market in the starch industry and

Bremner, an early maincrop general purpose variety, which shows high resistance to many common diseases.
